The Rural Teacher Education Pathway allows students from Lincoln County to complete the first two years of a Bachelor of Science in Education at Oregon Coast Community College and then transfer to Western Oregon University, with no loss of credit.

Students pursuing Early Childhood/Elementary or Elementary/Middle School preparation pathways will transfer to Western Oregon University (relocation not required) to complete the third year of study at WOU before returning to the Coast to complete their fourth year of study – including licensure and a student-teaching assignment with the Lincoln County School District.
