## **COMMUNICATION RUBRIC**





**Definition:** Communication is the development and expression of ideas. Communication involves learning to work in many genres and styles and can involve working with many different technologies, mixing texts, data, and images. Communication abilities develop through iterative experiences across the curriculum. Each student is scored, and then an individual average is applied and then rounded to the nearest whole number. This corresponds to the student achievement levels for the CILO on the assessment matrix.

Evaluators are encouraged to assign a zero to any work that does not meet base "emerging" level performance.
