





Preliminary data reflect strong winter enrollment, and modest YTD gains over last year.



Year-to-date 2022-23 FTE: **340.2** 



- The \$5,000 will fund continued expansion of the ESL programming at the North County Center, where enrollment has increased tenfold in the past two years.






