Program Description

EMT Basic Interest Form Fall 2023 Term

The OCCC EMT Program has the responsibility to society to educate competent health care providers to care for their patients/clients using critical judgment, broadly based knowledge, and competent technical skills at the entry level. The Basic EMT course includes two terms of instruction - EMS 105 and EMS 106. After successful completion of all requirements for EMT training, the student is eligible to apply to take the state licensure exams.

EMS 105: Term One Course Description & Objectives - Fall 2023

Develops skills for the recognition of symptoms of illness and injuries and proper procedures of emergency care. Requires passing criminal background check and drug screen, immunization records, and current BLS CPR card through the American Heart Association before placement into mandatory clinical observation in hospital emergency department and ambulance ride-along experience. Part 1 of the 2-part Oregon EMT course. Department permission required. Prerequisite: WR 115; MTH 20; RD 90

Course Objectives:

Upon successful completion students should be able to:

- Perform basic elements of patient assessment, in order to progress to EMS 106
- 2. Form a general field impression of patient condition based on basic patient assessment tools
- 3. Integrate knowledge and observations in the clinical setting to delineate the EMT-Basic roles and responsibilities
- 4. Assess, treat, transport, document, and verbally report for a variety of medical emergencies.

EMS 106: Term Two Course Description & Objectives - Winter 2023

Continues EMS 105, Oregon EMT preparation, includes preparation for state and national certification exams. Department permission required. Prerequisite: Successful completion of EMS 105 within the last year; current Healthcare Provider through the American Heart Association CPR card.

Course Objectives:

Upon successful completion students should be able to:

- Integrate knowledge and observations in the clinical setting to delineate the EMT roles and responsibilities
- 2. Assess, treat, transport, document, and verbally report for a variety of medical emergencies.

Lecture classes will provided via ZOOM on Mondays from 6-920 pm. The skills lab will be held at either the North Campus (Lincoln City) or Central Campus (Newport) on Wednesdays from 6-920 pm. Students must attend this class in person, there is no online option. There will be some Saturday classes each term; these dates will be announced the first week of class. The State Psychomotor Exam will be held in the Spring 2024 term, exact date TBA with testing at the OCCC North Campus (Lincoln City).

This course may be eligible for financial aid. Please meet with an academic advisor to discuss your options.

- 1) **Attendance:** The Oregon Health Division requires a specific number of hours to be eligible to apply for certification and thus if you do not attend classes as required you will not be eligible to take the final exam or the State exam. Hours required: as laid out in the course syllabus that you will receive the first day of class.
- 2) **GED/High School Diploma:** You must have a high school diploma or GED to apply for National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) and the Oregon EMS license/certification.
- 3) **Age Requirement:** You must be 18 years or older at the time of application to apply for the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians(NREMT) and Oregon EMS license/certification as an EMT.
- 4) **The COVID-19 Vaccination is required** as part of the EMT program. You must be fully vaccinated according to state and national standards prior to the start of the program.
